Explore Your Archive 2022

28th November - 6th December



Days are getting shorter and while the weather is very mild for November, the Christmas lights have been turned on which can only mean one thing – it is time to start planning for "Explore Your Archive". This is a special year for two reasons. It will be the first time in 3 years that an in-person event will take place to launch the year-long campaign, and this year marks its 10th year, which we hope you will help us celebrate with lots of events.

To mark this milestone, the ARA UK,I Explore Your Archive Committee have come up with some minor changes which ARA Ireland will be observing. Since the emphasis has been shifting from the week long campaign in November/December to a year-long campaign with a special Explore Your Archive day on the 10th of every month, we will no longer be calling this upcoming week a campaign or launch-week, but a focus-week. We still can't count though (!) so the focus week takes in nine days altogether, with the starting day moving to a Monday. The 2022 focus week will run from Monday 28th November to Tuesday 6th December. More details on the launch itself can be found later in this article.

For those not familiar with ARA's Explore Your Archive annual campaign, it aims to showcase the best of archives and archive services across Ireland and the UK and to make the public aware of the phenomenal array of archival collections held by organisations, both public and private, whatever their size and scale, and wherever their location.
